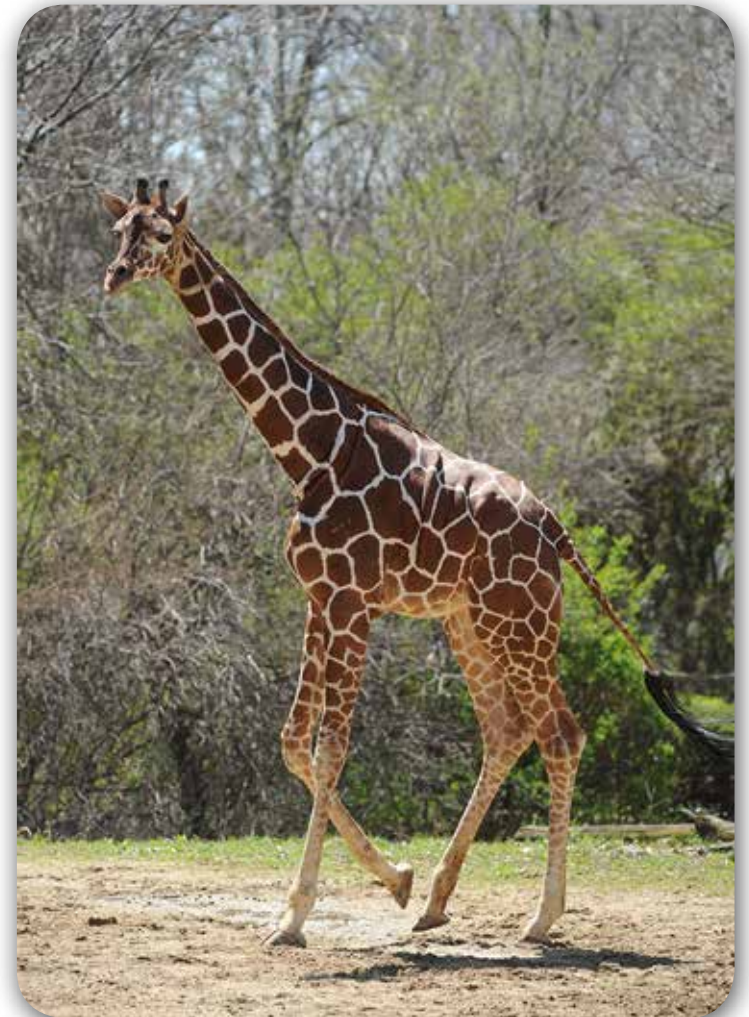

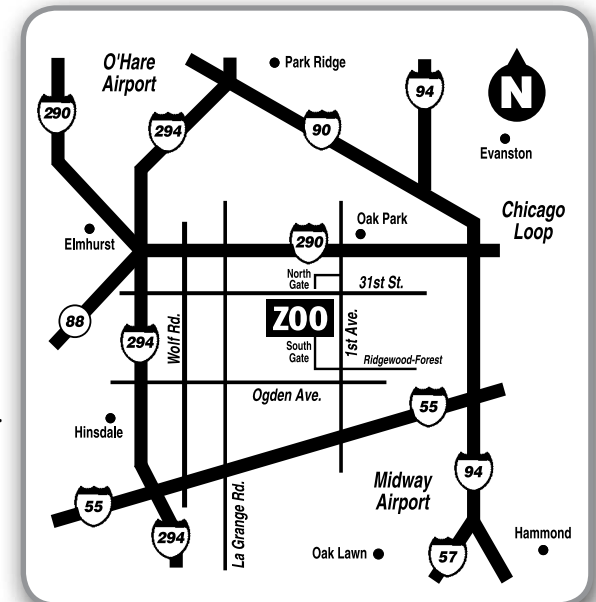
There are exits to First Avenue from the Eisenhower Expressway (I-290) and from the Stevenson Expressway (I-55).

ANIMAL ENCOUNTERS

Grades Pre-K through 3. \$4.00 per student.

NOTE: THIS CLASS IS 30 MINUTES LONG

Students meet and touch two live animals. Information is adjusted for the age of students. Their interests and questions guide the discussion on animal features and how they are alike and different.

HOW THINGS ARE WRAPPED

Available for all ages. \$4.50 per student.

Minimum of five students and maximum of 12 students with staff as required based on the needs of the group.

Use your senses to explore real animal artifacts, photos, and live animals. Find out how different animals use their fur, skin, feathers, and scales. This class can be modified, including class length, to meet the particular needs of your group. A visit to Hamill Family Play Zoo is included.

Connections Classes

AFRICA: THE LAND, THE PEOPLE, THE ANIMALS

Grades 4 through 6. \$4.50 per student.

To facilitate this class, three adults are required.

The awe and wonder of Africa await your students as they engage in hands-on activities. Investigate three human cultures surviving in three diverse ecosystems: the rain forest, the savannah, and the desert. After your class, you are invited to visit Africa's famous animals, such as gorillas, monkeys, giraffes, zebras, meerkats, and more for the self-guided portion of your day.

ANIMAL ADAPTATIONS

Grades 1 through 4. \$4.50 per student.

To facilitate this class, four adults are required.

What makes the "perfect animal"? Students will find out as they build their own animals, touch animal artifacts, and meet an animal up close. After class, students and their chaperones can explore the park to find animals that are perfectly suited to their habitats.

NGSS: 1-LS1-1, 2-LS4-1, 3-LS3-2, 4-LS1-1

ANIMAL BITES

Grades 2 through 4. \$4.50 per student.

To facilitate this class, four adults are required.

Learn more about what different animals eat by exploring their teeth. Using observation, games, and hands-on activities, students will learn to sort animals into groups based on the foods they eat. Your students will have the opportunity to use real animal skulls to practice identifying herbivores, carnivores, and omnivores.

ANIMALS THAT FLY

Grades 1 and 2. \$4.50 per student.

Birds are not the only animals that fly. Learn about bats, insects, and other flying animals and how they move through the air. Students will use hands-on activities to discover more about flying.

Bats aren't blind, they won't fly into your hair, and they don't—technically—suck blood. Students will have an introduction to bats and bat artifacts. At the end of your classroom program, students and their chaperones can take a self-guided trip to Australia to observe the bats.

BEARS

Grades Pre-K and K. \$4.50 per student.

To facilitate this class, a 1:5 ratio of chaperones to students is recommended.

Come see our bears in Great Bear Wilderness. In this class, students will investigate artifacts and compare themselves to bears. After an introduction to bears, students will follow their zoo instructor to the bear viewing windows to talk about our live bears. **Please remember to dress for the weather.**

Learn through observation! Immerse your students in our Butterflies! Exhibit. Students will practice observation and investigation skills through guided inquiry. They will discuss patterns as well as structure and function of butterflies within their habitat. **This class includes tickets to the Brookfield Zoo Butterflies! Exhibit and will be outdoors. Please remember to dress for the weather.**

CRITTER COVERINGS

If you want to sort animals, think of coverings! Visit Brookfield Zoo to learn how to recognize and categorize mammals, birds, reptiles, and amphibians. Hands-on activities, songs, and contact with live animals will help your students learn to sort animal groups.

DESERT COMMUNITIES

Your students will find out what's so hot about deserts when they use inquiry to conduct experiments and meet a live desert animal. After your hands-on class, you are invited to take your students to The Fragile Kingdom, where they will see firsthand what they have learned.

ANIMAL TRAINING AND ENRICHMENT

We feed the bodies and minds of zoo animals. The animals become the students when we teach them how to participate in their own care. Discover how ordinary items such as pumpkins become teaching tools and how you can also enrich the lives of your pets.

HABITAT DESIGN

Connections Classes

Connections classes are \$200 for one classroom of students (normal maximum size 30 students) and \$100 for each additional classroom taking the same class in a back-to-back schedule. A fee of \$50 per hour of wait time will be charged between nonconsecutive classes. Classroom teachers must be present during the classroom. Zoo-To-You classes are available for schools up to 30 miles away from the zoo, with a charge of \$0.50 per mile.

PRICES FOR ILLINOIS SCHOOL GROUPS

Free general admission is available to Head Start, home school, public, and private Illinois school groups of K-college for self-guided field trips (parking and attraction fees still apply), but two weeks' advance notice are required. An Illinois school group is defined as a classroom teacher accompanying his or her students, Monday-Friday, during the normal school year. **Note: groups that do not meet these qualifications will be notified.** Make your reservations early—space is limited. For spring trips, please make your reservations two months in advance. For all other seasons, please make your reservations at least two weeks in advance. No reservations will be accepted less than two weeks before your requested field trip date.

Master's Degree: Advanced Inquiry Program (AIP)

The Chicago Zoological Society and Project *Dragonfly* at Miami University in Ohio partner to bring an exciting master's degree to Chicagoland. The AIP is a conservation-focused, inquiry-driven learning experience. It combines web-based graduate courses through Miami University with face-to-face learning and field study at Brookfield Zoo.

ELIGIBILITY

Enrollment is open to applicants with a bachelor's degree regardless of academic major or profession. The AIP can be completed part-time while working and is designed for anyone interested in contributing to social and ecological change in their community.

DEGREES

Applicants elect to enroll in either a Master of Arts in Teaching in Biological Sciences (MAT, designed for certified teachers) or a Master of Arts in Biology. MA and MAT candidates go through the AIP together. Degrees are conferred from Miami University.

Part of a family of master's programs, the AIP leverages the learning resources of Project *Dragonfly*, a leader in inquiry-driven and publicly engaged education.

REQUIREMENTS

Participants earn 35 total credit hours: 14 credit hours of core courses that occur on the web and 21 credit hours of Web+ courses that combine web-based instruction with experiential learning on-site at Brookfield Zoo. Seven credit hours may come from a global field course. The AIP can be completed in 2.5 years.
